KDI School of Public Policy and Management will be holding its G20 Global Leadership Program for 2021 from April 21~ June 2, 2021.

This is a blended program that will be offered using online and offline methodology. Calling upon participants to share their respective experiences, the online lectures will include lessons from Korea's development experience with regards to growth strategies, trade and industrial policies, human development and other key development areas. G20 development agenda issues will also be addressed. Topics that may be covered during the course include how to overcome challenges to development amidst global changes in healthcare, energy, climate change and technology.

The program also incorporates a Field Study trip to Korea. This Field Study component is designed to optimize opportunities for participants to engage in in-depth discussions with the speakers and fellow G20 participants, as well as participate in activities outside the classroom that can build upon your online/classroom learnings.

This program has been designed for experienced managers and practitioners of G20 countries and developing countries. As part of the Korean government's dedication to the G20 Development Agenda set forth in the Seoul Development Consensus for Shared Growth, each participant will be hosted by the KDI School and the Ministry of Economy and Finance.

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
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Program Objective

The G20 Global Leadership Program is co-hosted by the Ministry of Economy and Finance and the Korea Development Institute (KDI) School of Public Policy and Management.

As part of Korea's commitment to the G20 Seoul Development Consensus for Shared Growth set forth at the Seoul Summit in 2010, which aimed "to add value to and complement existing development commitments," this program aims to enhance the participants' ability to contribute to economic growth and reach global development goals in their respective countries and in the professional capacities they currently hold.

Program Structure

This is a blended program that will be offered using online and offline methodology. Calling upon participants to share their respective experiences, the online lectures will include lessons from Korea's development experience with regards to growth strategies, trade and industrial policies, human development and other key development areas. G20 development agenda issues will also be addressed. Topics that may be covered during the course include how to overcome challenges to development amidst global changes in healthcare, energy, climate change and technology.

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Program Information

Who should Attend

This program is designed for experienced practitioners and decision makers who will be working in some capacity as a leader, change agent, or facilitator in promoting global development or G20 agenda-setting.

Each applicant should possess a minimum of three years of work experience, or be at the middle manager level in his/her current field. A strong proficiency in the English language is required, as all courses and coursework will be conducted in English.

When & How

- **(Online) Live Streaming & e-Education:** The online program will be held from April 21 - June 2, 2021. There will be one (1) lecture every week, and the lectures will be live-streamed via Zoom. The participants who are not able to join the live streaming lecture due to the time difference, can view the recorded video lecture from KDI School's e-Education Website.
- **(Offline) Field Study:** After completing the online learning component of the program, participants will be invited to Korea to attend the Field Study program, which is tentatively scheduled for August, 2021.
